



## ***Harps of the North : Edvard Grieg and Andreas Munch in the World of Walter Scott* - film contribution to the Walter Scott 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary year**

To celebrate composer Edvard Grieg's birthday, the Grieg Society of Scotland is delighted to announce the release of its film contribution to the Walter Scott 250 Year.

Decades after his death, Walter Scott was still a major influence on writers and musicians in Europe and Scandinavia. Two who felt this influence were the young Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg and his older, then more famous compatriot, the poet Andreas Munch.

This film explores the making of a song 'Harpen' ('The Harp') - composed by Grieg to words by Munch - that was created in Rome and stimulated by a pilgrimage to Abbotsford. The song is performed by singer and pianist Sally Garden.

Edvard Grieg, Norwegian composer of Scottish descent was born in 1843 in Bergen. Popularly known for his music to 'Peer Gynt', and his 'Lyric Pieces' for piano, he advanced the cause of Norwegian music on the world stage, and when Norway won independence in 1905, looked back at his work with the cry 'Freedom is the fight for freedom'.

Andreas Munch was the most important and famous Norwegian poet of the mid-nineteenth century. On his 'pilgrimage' to Abbotsford and Loch Katrine in 1862, he asked the question 'What is Scotland without Walter Scott?' later publishing a journal of his travels.

The film shows the deep and lasting influence Walter Scott had on major figures in Europe and - the subject of this film – Scandinavia.
